This term, our Come & See topics are:

<u>Maths</u>

The following aspects of mathematics will be covered this term: place value; addition, subtraction, multiplication & division; fractions, position & direction. Within each unit, children will develop their Fluency,

Reasoning and then Problem Solving skills.

<u>Science</u>

In science, children will learn about the Human Circulatory System . We will be looking at keeping our body (especially the heart) healthy and then moving onto studying the blood and circulatory system in general.

English

The main areas to be covered in English are as gollows: diary writing, persuasive texts, nonchronological texts and narrative story writing. Please note that Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar are taught throughout each unit of work.

<u>Topic</u>

This half term, we take a trip to Mexico to learn all about the physical and human characteristics of this



country. We'll also step back in time and look at the Mayan Civilization and the incluence they had on the world today.

Agter Half Term, our topic will be Fallen Fields where we'll learn about WWI. What started it? What was it like waiting for those 'missing in action'? How did the soldiers endure conditions in the trenches? We'll also look at how a gragile peace was finally achieved.

Our topic (Hola Mexico) began successfully with our Launch day where pupils began the term by learning about Dia de los Muertos and made music, created and ate skeleton bread and learnt a lot about Mexican music and culture.

We will end our topic in October with a Landing Day - an opportunity to showcase all of the wanderful learning we have been doing. More details of this will follow in a few weeks.

Art

During the first half term, we'll develop our sculpture skills through the making Day of the Dead sugar skulls. This will involve the use of Modroc which is an exciting technique to learn.
