Attendance

Overall attendance for the last academic year was 95.78%, which is slightly below our Trust target of 97%. This year, we ask for your continued support as we work in partnership to ensure that school attendance is high. Please be reminded that the Department for Education states that:

- Parents and carers have a duty to ensure that their child attends regularly at school, where that child is a registered pupil at school and of a compulsory school age;
- If your child is unwell or unable to attend school for whatever reason, you must notify school;
- Schools have a responsibility to record attendance and follow up all absences;
- Schools may issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices in line with the local authority's guidelines.

As stated in our <u>Pupil Attendance Policy</u>, leave of absence which has not been approved will be unauthorised and may lead to a referral being made to the Local Authority for action. For schools within Nottinghamshire County Council, a Penalty Notice will be requested if an unauthorised holiday is taken in excess of 3 days/6 sessions (over a 6 week rolling period).

Thank you in advance for your support in ensuring your child attends all possible sessions.

School Uniform

It's wonderful to see that the children have returned to school looking smart in their school uniform. It is our expectation that all children will wear their full school uniform everyday except on PE days for children in FS and KS1. May I remind you that this includes black shoes and not trainers. Clear guidance of our uniform can be found here. Children can continue to wear their summer uniform until October Half Term.

Girls: Summer Uniform:

Blue and white checked dress

Short sleeve blouse and school tie

Pale blue polo shirt

Grey skirt

Grey cardigan

White socks

Sensible shoes/sandals not trainers

Boys: Summer Uniform

Short sleeve shirt and school tie

pale blue polo shirt

Grey shorts or trousers

Grey jumper

Black or grey socks

Sensible shoes *not* trainers

Please also note that for children with long hair, this must always be tied back.

The uniform for PE is: Plain black shorts, plain white t-shirt, black plimsolls. Older pupils may require tracksuits and football boots or trainers for outdoor games.

School Singing Programme

New for this year, we have signed up to benefit from the Diocese of Nottingham Singing Programme, which aims to enhance musical education in Catholic schools across the Diocese. Our Year 3 and Year 4 children will receive weekly 30 minute sessions, delivered by experienced and trained professionals, which help children to interact with their faith through music. This programme is in additional to the children's Music Curriculum.

In addition to this Programme, the Cathedral are launching the **Mansfield Children's Choir**, which is an exciting opportunity for children in Mansfield to become singers of the future. The session will run each Wednesday from **4:30pm** — **5:45pm** at **St. Philip's Church**; the first rehearsal is next week, on **Wednesday 14th September**.
