This term, our Come & See topics are:

<u>Maths</u>

The following aspects of mathematics will be covered this term: place value; addition, subtraction, multiplication & division and fractions.

Within each unit, children will develop their Fluency, Reasoning and then Problem Solving skills as we endeavour to deepen children's mathematical understanding.

<u>English</u>

The main areas to be covered in English are as follows: Instructions and writing an interesting character description.

Please note that Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar are taught throughout each unit of work.

<u>Science</u>

In science, children will learn about the topics Micro-organisms and Earth and Space.

<u>Topic</u>

This half term, our topic is 'Pharaohs'. It is our mission to become experts in the study of Ancient Egypt.

After Half Term, our topic will be 'Peasants, Princes and Pestilence' which will take us into the dark and deadly world of 14th century Britain,

<u>Computing</u>

This term, the focus of our learning will be E-Safety and Databases. We will also be using the internet to support our research of our topics.

<u>PE</u>

PE will be on a Monday and Tuesday this term so your child will need their PE on these days. However, I would strongly advise that your child's PE kit is in school all week in case of any timetabling changes.
