<u>RE</u>

This term, our Come & See topics are:

- Books—. Investigating the books used in Church on Sunday by the parish community.
- Thanksgiving—learning about different ways to say thank you and how the parish family thanks God for Jesus
- Opportunities -.Finding out about Lent, and the opportunity to turn towards what is good in preparation for Easter.

<u>Maths</u>

The following aspects of mathematics will be covered this term: Properties of shape, money, multiplication and division. .

Within each unit, children will develop their Fluency, Reasoning and then Problem Solving skills as we endeavor to deepen children's mathematical understanding.

<u>English</u>

In English we will focus on writing for enjoyment using 'The Elephant Dance' written by Thersa Heine; We will write to inform by producing a non-chronological reports about the UK. In Grammar we will focus on developing expanded noun phrases and using adverbs. Our punctuation focus will be to use commas correctly in lists.

Computing

Our units this term are how to create and use spreadsheets and the importance of accurate questioning when researching.

<u>Science</u>

In science, children will learn about Plants, We will be learning all about the conditions a plant needs to grow well. We will then move on to focus



on Living things and their habitats. Including micro-habitats and minibeast hunting around school.

<u>Topic</u>

This half term, our topic is Let's Explore the World. We begin by looking at the United Kingdom and we will use maps to show where all 4 countries are and talk about the features we find in the capital cities. We will also use maps to find surrounding seas and look at different climates within the world and further our knowledge of continents and oceans.

After Half Term, our topic will be 'Land Ahoy' where we'll learn how to research historical figures using famous pirates. We will also further our knowledge of map skills using compass directions and locating different oceans/seas.

PE

PE this half term children will be doing target games and invasion games.
