

Music

Music is taught by specialist teachers from OLQL. In the first half term, children will learn how: recognize and identify different music styles within musical theatre. They will know how to perform in time to the beat, improvise to the beat, compose an 8 beat rhythm, sing and perform sections of a piece of music and comment on compositions and improvisations.

In the second half term, children will learn: the sounds of South Africa and follow the ideas of performance, compositions and improvisation when looking at a piece of music.

French

Monsieur Etienne will teach French to the class each week. In Summer 1, pupils will learn 'Les Quatre Amis' (The Four Friends). In Summer 2, pupils will study 'ça pousse!' (Growing things).

Art/DT

During the first half term, we will be looking at primary and secondary colours and using these to improve our painting skills by painting things we can see. After half term we will be looking at our drawing skills and different pencils.

Phonics

As a school we now follow the Little Wandle accredited phonics scheme.

In this Curriculum Matters booklet, you'll find a summary of the main areas of study this term, which I hope you will find useful.

Homework

Homework will be given out on a Friday and is to be returned to school on the following Wednesday. Homework will consist of a Maths and English piece, Guided Reading as well as a weekly Spelling List. Please continue to hear your child read, if possible for 5 minutes a day. Thank you in advance for supporting your child with their homework.



RE

This term, our Come & See topics are:

- Holidays and Holydays, where we'll look at different days in the Churches calendar;
- Being sorry, friendships and relationships enable human beings to live together;
- Neighbours, we all feel a need to look after what is special to us.

Maths

The following aspects of mathematics will be covered this term: multiplication and division, fractions, position and direction, place value within 100, money and time.

Within each unit, children will develop their Fluency, Reasoning and then Problem Solving skills as we endeavour to deepen children's mathematical understanding.

English

The main areas to be covered in English are as follows: adventure stories; letter writing; traditional tales; newspaper articles and instructions. Please note that Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar are taught throughout each unit of work.

Science

In science, children will learn about plants. After half term we will be

looking at seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK.

Topic

This half term, we are going to be looking at the Bright Lights, Big City of London with a focus on the adventures of Paddington Bear. We will be looking at the countries of the UK and their capital cities, geographical features found in the UK and comparing these to a contrasting country, Africa.

After Half Term, our topic will be Rain or Shine where we will be looking at the weather and the different seasons.

Computing

This term, children will learn about coding and making an animated story book.

PE

PE will be on a Tuesday and Friday this term so your child can come to school in their PE on these days.
