RE

This term, our Come & See topics are:

- Energy, in which we will study Pentecost.

Maths

The following aspects of mathematics will be covered this term: Length & Perimeter, Fractions, Mass & Capacity, Money, Time and Shape.

Within each unit, children will develop their Fluency, Reasoning and Problem Solving skills as we endeavour to deepen children's mathematical understanding.

English

The main areas to be covered in English are as follows: poetry, stories with a familiar setting, biographies and non-chronological reports. We continue to build on the fantastic learning that the children have already done in grammar, adding new concepts such as non-finite clauses and

Science

Children will be learning about animals, including humans. This will be an opportunity for the children to study the human digestive system, skeleton and musculature.

Computing

This half term, we will be learning about coding.

After half term, we will be studying simulations and databases.

Topic

We have a new topic this term; What Makes Britain Great? We will be looking at the human and physical geography of the British Isles, learning about the difference between continents, countries, countries and cities, and the features of Nottinghamshire and the surrounding area.

After the half term holidays, we will begin our ginal topic: Groovy Greeks. We will study the culture, achievements and legacy of the Ancient Greek civilization.

PE
