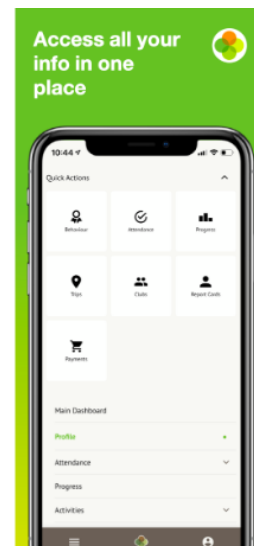
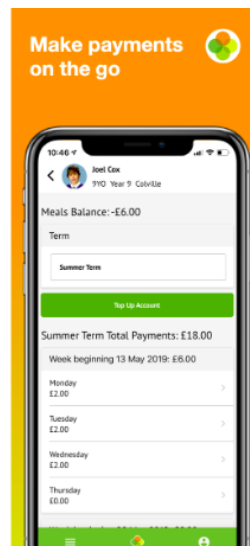
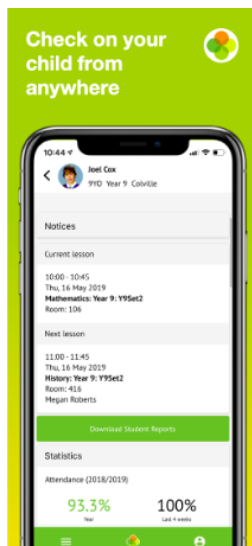
After Half Term, Mass will be celebrated with Year 3 on Wednesday 8th June at 9.30am. It would be lovely if you could join us in church.
