
#### Introducing our Lay Chaplains: Luke & Clare



To develop this further, I am delighted to inform you that we have two new Lay Chaplains working with us this year: Luke Potter and Clare Lund. Both colleagues know our school community well having both attended All Saints' as students. Both are also parishioners at St. Philip's. Having met with our Lay Chaplains, they have lots of new and exciting ideas as to how they will further inspire our children both spiritually and morally. It's been a pleasure to welcome them to our school community. They will be working in our school every Thursday for the full day.

### International Day of Peace

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Yesterday was the UN's International Day of Peace. To mark this important date, some of our school Chaplaincy Team took part in a Hub event, working in collaboration with our brothers and sisters from our family of schools. The children and young people were able to share ideas about being agents of peace. They created peace prayers and raps, established peace missions to share with the rest of their school communities and shared in a peace-themed act of liturgical prayer. Our Lay Chaplains, Clare and Luke, were delighted with their efforts, their teamwork and their willingness to live out Jesus' message: 'Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you.' #### **Nut Free School**

Since the beginning of this term, new pupils with severe nut allergies have joined our school. In response to this, we are now completely nut free due to these children's allergy being life threatening. The children suffer an allergic reaction (anaphylactic shock) through ingestion of nut products, cross contamination and by breathing nut dust in the air. It really is that serious. Therefore, we are asking for all members of our school community to help minimise the risk to these children by:



- 1) Avoiding giving your child/children nuts or products that contain nuts in packed lunches.
- 2) Avoiding giving your child/children nuts or nut products including cereal bars that contain nuts for breaktimes.
- 3) Avoiding items that contains nuts when supplying us with cakes, treats etc. for birthday celebrations, sales or events.

Please note that where a member of staff notices a pupil eating a nut product, it will be removed politely and the member of staff will explain why this has been done. A message/call will then be made to the parent to explain why this has happened so they are fully informed and to remind them of the nut-free policy.

Thank you in advance for your efforts to protect these children.

For parents of pupils in Year 6, the time has arrived for you to begin the process of applying for a secondary school place. It is absolutely essential that all applications are made to your home Local Authority by the national closing date of Tuesday 31st October, 2023. Nottinghamshire applications can be made <a href="here">here</a>. Nottinghamshire County Council have produced this <a href="factsheet">factsheet</a> to make the process easier for you.

For the overwhelming majority of you who will be applying for a place at All Saints', please note that you must complete a **Supplementary Form** from All Saints' **as well as** the **Local Authority application form**. If you are having any difficulties, please speak to a member of the Year 6 team, or to Mrs Shivley or Mr Steele who will be only too happy to help. It is important to note that if a late application is made, then this will not be considered until all other applications have been allocated; this means you may not be allocated a place in your preferred choice of school.
