As you'll see, this agreement outlines what parents can expect from the school but also what school expects of parents. It is anticipated that such a document will ensure continuing positive relationships between home and school. We are extremely fortunate in our community because interactions between school and home are incredibly positive nearly all of the time; however, there are some rare occasions where this is not the case.

Upon receipt of the Home-School agreement next week, we ask that you read this carefully, sign and then return. A copy will then be retained in your child's personal file. I have every confidence that this Home-School Agreement will further strengthen our already positive relationships.
