Throughout the week, teachers have delivered activities to remind children what bullying is — when someone seeks to harm us Several Times On Purpose — and to know that this is unacceptable. Teachers have also shared our <u>Anti-Bullying Policy</u> so all children know how to respond if they suspect bullying or are being harmed or bullied.

Attendance & Punctuality

Average attendance so far this year is 94.5%; this is just below National figures of 94.9% but lower than our target of 97%. At the end of half term, letters were sent home to all families with concerning attendance; the attendance of these pupils is now being reviewed. Where there has been little or no improvement, parents will be invited to attend an Attendance Improvement Meeting.

We appreciate that this time of year can be tricky with illnesses; however, children who do not attend school regularly often struggle to catch up with work missed or become anxious learners. With this in mind, we are hopeful that attendance rates improve across this half term. We are already seeing an improvement this week, which is great.

Applying for a Reception place 2024-25

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If your child turns 5 between 1st September 2024 and 31 August 2025 and you require a school place for September 2024, you can now apply for their place. The application window will be open until the deadline of Monday 15th January 2024. Applications can be made quickly and easily through the <u>Nottinghamshire County Coun-</u> <u>cil Admissions Hub</u>. Please also remember to submit a Supplementary Information Form if you wish for a school place to be considered under a faith criterion. Please note that you MUST include the supporting evidence with this form. If you are unable to locate the required faith evidence, please contact the parish where your child was baptised in good time for a 'copy' certificate to be supplied. **All the details and relevant forms can be found on the Admissions section of our <u>website</u>.**
