Our curriculum

We strive to offer the very best for all pupils and are proud of our thematic, topic-based curriculum. It is designed to ensure that all children achieve. Each subject has been carefully planned so that knowledge and skills are acquired progressively. This deepens understanding and helps pupils to make links within and across subjects. All lessons begin with a Recap section to support pupils to retain and recall new knowledge.

In additional to high quality classroom teaching in all subjects, we also benefit from having subject specialist providers who teach French, Music and PE across the school. This ensures our children acquire the very best wider curriculum knowledge. The Curriculum section of our website contains a full breakdown of the learning that takes place in each subject across the school.

Teaching and learning

All lessons are derived from the school's Long and Medium Term Plans, which ensures content is delivered as agreed. Knowledge and skills are develop sequentially, which maximises attainment and avoids cognitive overload. Our skilled teachers ensure that all lessons are planned so that pupils can be supported, challenged and inspired whatever their ability. Teachers track pupils' progress carefully within and between lessons and use this to inform subsequent teaching.

Every class is supported by a teaching assistant who provides small group and individual support and challenge. They also deliver 'IMPACT' sessions for pupils who may not have understood a concept taught in a lesson. This secures understanding and ensures they are ready for the next step in learning. Our skilled support staff also deliver tailored interventions based on individual pupil needs.







We recognise the importance of our children flourishing academically but also prioritise their personal, social, emotional and spiritual development. We want each child to know they are loved and made in the image of God, and that we all have our own unique gifts and qualities.

We teach the importance of British Values and deepen this learning by using the Catholic Social Teaching principles, our School Virtues and our Mission Statement to discover fully what it means to be a good person and to live a good life, drawing upon the example of Jesus. Our aim is for all pupils to leave our school fully equipped to contribute to life in modern Britain and become everything that they were created to be.

Collective and personal prayer is central to school life and is a part of every school day. This takes place either with the



whole school, in key stages or at a classroom level. From a very young age, our children take pride in being responsible for the planning, leading and evaluation of acts of worship.

We are blessed to have a range of prayer spaces in school additional to those in classrooms - our Sacred Space, Liturgical Lounge and Spiritual Garden. These spaces are treasured and used regularly to help our children encounter Lord Jesus.

Forest Schools

All pupils have an opportunity every year to engage with the Forest Schools programme. Forest Schools is a child-centred inspirational learning process. It is a long-term programme that supports play, exploration and risk-taking. It develops confidence and self-esteem through learner inspired, hands on experiences in our beautiful natural and extensive outdoor learning environment.

OPAL Lunchtimes

OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning) is a programme that enhances every child's lunchtime experience. Children have a plethora of activities to engage in: from small-world toys and games, including Lego, dress up and building blocks, to wheeled toys, pogo sticks, a mud kitchen, large tyres, den-making resources and much, much more! Not only does this make lunchtimes great fun and increases physical activity, but it also develops imagination, cooperation and creativity.

Wrap Around Care

As a school, we recognise that working parents require childcare before and after school. Our Wrap Around provider, The Lime Trees, offers a warm, caring, inclusive environment from 7.30am until 6pm. Pupils are provided with breakfast and a healthy light tea is provided.

Our community

Our school enjoys a strong, positive partnership with parents/carers. Children are greeted each day by our staff who are always happy to speak to parents, either to receive a message, extend our support or to offer advice as and when necessary. Children are greeted each day by our staff Children involved in their learning; this can be arranged by calling the school office and making an appointment. Children can join Nursery as soon as they turn three,

Parents and carers are warmly welcomed into our community. Prior to starting school, parents of new pupils are given an opportunity to meet with a member of the staff team to share information abut their child, ask questions, look around our school and meet their teacher.

All parents/carers are encouraged to share their child's successes by attending our varies assemblies. We also use a communication app, called Class Dojo, to update parents with whole school and class events and activities.

For parents who would like to become more involved with our school, they are invited to join our Parents Teacher Association (PTA). Our PTA volunteers work together to provide opportunities for our children and to raise funds for school projects, and would welcome anyone who could spare some of their time to help. Further to this, parents/ carers have the opportunity to join our Local Governing Body as a Foundation or Parent Governor

Joining St. Philip Neri

Children can join Nursery as soon as they turn three, provided we have a space available. We offer both 15 and 30 hours of Nursery provision. Applications for a place in Nursery can be made directly to the school by contacting the school office.

Children join Reception in the September after they turn four. Parents/carers should apply for a Reception place when their child is three. The window to apply for a Reception class place opens in November and closes in January. Parents are notificed in April if their child has been given a place in our school. zlf offered a place, we provide opportunities for children to make regular visits to our school in June and July to help them become familiar with our staff and setting prior to starting in the September.
