Nottinghamshire Libraries: Summer Reading Challenge



Produced by The Reading Agency and run in partnership with libraries across the country the <u>Summer Reading Challenge</u> is a great way to keep children reading over the summer. Taking part can help avoid the potential dip in reading levels over the long summer break and provides free fun for 4-11 year olds. There are stickers to collect and a medal and certificate when a child completes the Challenge.

This year's challenge is **Story Garden**, which celebrates nature and the great outdoors, exploring adventure, fantasy and the magical world of storytelling.

The challenge runs in Nottinghamshire libraries from now until 1 September.

How does the Challenge work?

- Children sign up at their local library and receive a free sticker book.
- Children borrow and read at least six library books, of their choice, during the summercollecting stickers and other incentives along the way.
- Children who complete the Summer Reading Challenge receive a certificate and medal.

To help us return missing items to their owner, PLEASE ensure your child's name is clearly marked in all belongings especially why buying new items over the summer for next year.

School Bags & Water Bottles

As shared in the last few editions of the Newsletter, our PTA have kindly donated a brand new Book Bag for each child, all of which have had each child's name written on the tag ready for them to be handed out. **Please note that these Book Bags will replace your child's current school bag from September.** Over the last few years, some children are using bags that are much bigger than necessary, and these bulky items are taking up too much space in our cloakrooms. From September, your child will only need to bring with them their reading book and any homework books. All other stationery and equipment is already provided by school so is not needed. In appreciation for supplying waterproofs, we are also giving each child in Years 1-6 a named, drawstring bag to keep their waterproofs in from September. These will be handed out next week with the book bags.

We're also seeing an increase in the size of children's water bottles coming into school. Smaller water bottles are easier for children to handle and help minimize the risk of spillages. We ask for your support in ensuring that your child's water bottle is no larger than 750ml and has a secure, leak-proof lids. We recommend Metal water bottles as these keep the water colder for a much longer period and typically come with a secure lid. Thanks in advance for your support with this. Please note that children have access to water coolers which provide cold and refreshing filtered drinking water.

Thank you to those that joined us for the final Toddler Tales of the year. We've had great fun getting to know these little ones over the last few years and it's been delightful to see how their confidence has grown. We'll be back in September and look forward to meeting our next group of children and their families.
