
Year 6 Parents — Secondary Applications

For parents of pupils in Year 6, the time has arrived for you to begin the process of applying for a secondary school place. It is absolutely essential that all applications are made to your home Local Authority by the national closing date of Friday 31st October, 2025 or the Local Authority will assign a school of their choosing to your child. Nottinghamshire applications can be made here. Nottinghamshire County Council have produced this factsheet to make the process easier for you.

For the overwhelming majority of you who will be applying for a place at All Saints', please note that you must complete a **Supplementary Form** from All Saints' **as well as** the **Local Authority application form**. Information on admissions to All Saints' can be found here.
